Welcome to the Wilmington Housing Authority's (WHA) Quarterly Newsletter.

The WHA is the largest direct provider of affordable housing opportunities in the State of Delaware. We are committed to developing, providing, and managing safe and affordable housing for low-income families in the City of Wilmington.

During the second quarter, the Wilmington Housing Authority YouthBuild Program continued to support participants in achieving their professional goals. Youth in the program completed their work readiness training and GED studies. While in the program, the youth also participated in team building exercises and identified their career goals and aspirations.

Division of Services for Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities (DSAAPD) continued providing workshops and on-site support to WHA residents. DSAAPD will continue to host workshops once a month at five WHA locations.

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WHA RESIDENTS PURCHASE THEIR FIRST HOME

The second quarter of 2023 was an exciting time for five WHA Resident Opportunities and Self Sufficiency (ROSS) Program participants who became first-time homeowners. There was a mix of market listed homes and Section 32 properties selected to begin establishing their purchased homes.

The new homeowners, along with WHA management, were all smiles with their first-time homeownership accomplishment. Ieshia Ward purchased a home in Wilmington in March. James Freeman, Kenya Watson and Tramayne McCray-Grosvenor all had their settlements in May. Dawn Williams settled on her home in June.

The WHA Section 32 Comprehensive Homeownership Program provides residents with the opportunity to purchase the units they currently reside. Residents must actively participate in the program and meet the financial qualifications to purchase the property.

During each participant's unique and intense path to homeownership, there are barriers to overcome and many new learning experiences. Darniece Hampton, WHA Service Coordinator Supervisor, shared that the journey to homeownership took several years of hard work for participants, but they did not give up.

Irmina Williams, WHA Resident Services Chief, stated the four participants completed their "Yellow Brick Road to Homeownership" which includes, but not limited to, active case management with their ROSS Service Coordinator as well as attending credit repair workshops and homebuyer's monthly meetings. Participants also attend financial coaching sessions with their Stand By Me Coach and housing counseling sessions with Housing Opportunities of Northern Delaware.

Each of the homeowners came away from the experience with wise advice to share with those in the process or considering this fulfilling journey. James Freeman, a single Dad, said "Believe that you can achieve good things even if others think you cannot." Two pieces of advice from Dawn Williams were to "stay the course and be patient because gaining homeownership takes time and some will try to deter you." Tramayne McCray-Grosvenor, shared "purchasing a home can be stressful and life can be challenging but keep a positive spirit through it all."

WHA congratulates each of these new homeowners on this tremendous life achievement and looks forward to additional success to their self-sufficiency.

BUILD CREDIT BY PAYING YOUR RENT

Delaware State Housing Authority in partnership with NeighborGood Partners (formerly NCALL) and Self Financial, Inc. offer Delaware Tenant Rent Reporting Pilot Program. This program helps build participants' credit by reporting on-time rent payments to Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion, and on-time utility payments to TransUnion. Participation is 100% free and voluntary.

KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT FOR 2023-2024

Christina School District Kindergarten registration is open. Students must be five-years-old by August 31 of the current school year to attend kindergarten. Kindergarten registration deadlines vary per school. Check with your local school district for specific timelines.

School Choice allows parents to enroll their child in a public school in any school district regardless of the student's home address. If you would like your child to attend a school other than your assigned school, you must apply for Delaware School Choice. Even if children are participating in School Choice, they need to register with your local elementary school first.

NEW BENEFITS FOR DELAWARE HEALTH CHILDREN PROGRAM

As of July 1, 2023, children enrolled in Delaware Healthy Children Program (DHCP) will have access to new free services introduced by Delaware Medicaid. Those new services are as follows:

Prescribed Pediatric Extended Care (PPEC)

Alternative to institutionalization or community/home care for children with medically complex or special healthcare needs.

Non-Emergency Medical Transportation

Free rides to medical and dental appointments when no other transportation is available.

RENEWALS HAVE BEGUN FOR MEDICAID & CHIP COVERAGE



As of April 1, 2023, annual Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) eligibility reviews began. Information on file will be used to decide if family members still qualify for Medicaid or CHIP coverage. Most children can still be covered through CHIP.

If more information is needed to make a coverage decision, a renewal letter will be mailed, so it's important for anyone who has moved, contact information should be updated.

There are 3 easy steps families can take to prepare for the renewal process:

1. Update contact information
2. Check mail
3. Complete renewal form (if they get one)

Report any name changes or contact updates (email/mail address, phone numbers) by calling the Change Report Center (302) 571-4900, Option 2, by fax (302) 571-4901, or through your Delaware ASSIST Account.

POSTPARTUM MEDICAID EXTENDED TO 12 MONTHS

Those enrolled in Medicaid will be eligible to receive 12 months of ongoing postpartum health care coverage beginning on the date their pregnancy ends, regardless of the reason, through 12 months after the last date of the pregnancy. They will remain eligible for ongoing postpartum health care coverage even if certain changes occur that may affect eligibility.

INSULIN MONTHLY FEE CAP FOR MEDICARE PART B & D BENEFICIARIES

As of July 1, 2023, insulin provided through a traditional pump is capped at \$35.00 per month under Medicare Part B. Part B beneficiaries have joined Medicare Part D beneficiaries who have benefited from this provision, since the start of 2023.

UTILITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIHEAP)

Delaware has two components to LIHEAP for helping income-eligible Delawareans during the winter months with their energy assistance needs.

FUEL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (FAP)

Fuel Assistance Program (FAP) provides help with home energy bills for both homeowners and renters from October 1st through March 31st. FAP grants for qualifying income-eligible families can be used for electricity, natural gas, propane, wood, kerosene or coal.

CRISIS INTERVENTION PROGRAM (CIP)

Crisis intervention Program (CIP) is offered during winter months. Families participating in this program must provide proof of crisis (i.e., shut off notice, no money to pay or out of fuel) in addition to income eligible to qualify.

WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (WAP)

WAP helps income-eligible Delaware renters and homeowners lower their energy bills through weather proofing and increasing the energy efficiency of their homes at NO COST. An assessment by a WAP professional will be completed to identify what enhancements, such as weather stripping or insulation, can be provided to reduce your energy bills.

WATER ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH) Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP), provides assistance to eligible households to pay water and wastewater bills.

- Prevent disconnection of household water services
- Help reduce current household water bills

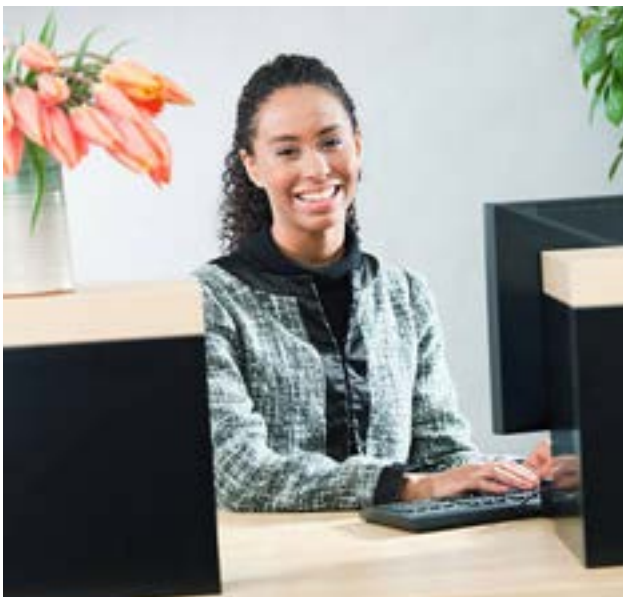
